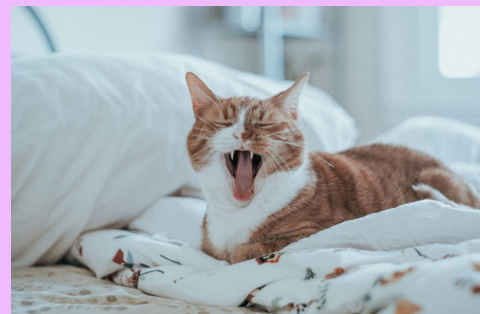

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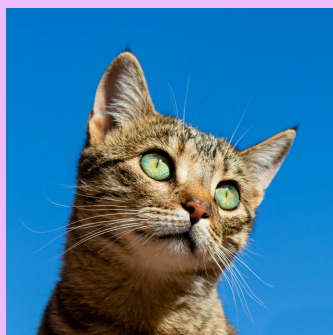

Stress triggers cats to scratch more than any other factor, and it's exacerbated when young children are around, according to Frontiers in Veterinary Science findings, which also note that long play sessions and nocturnal activity increase scratching. Veterinary researcher Yasemin Salgirli Demirbas says the study suggests several ways to calm scratching, including short play sessions that mimic successful hunting, safe hiding places, elevated observation perches and occasional outdoor exploration.

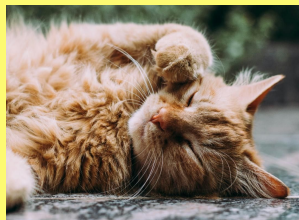
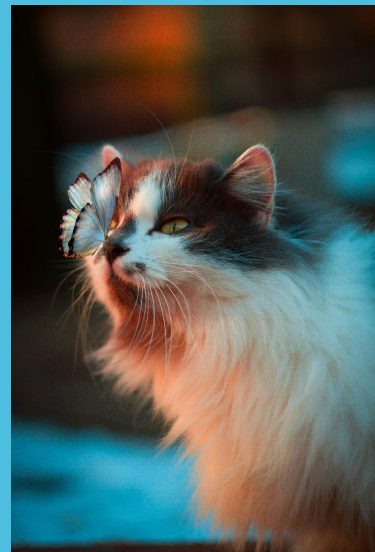
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Understanding Your Cat: The Power of Slow Blinking

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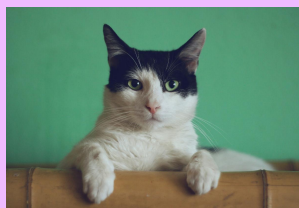


Treat the cat or treat the person to quell allergies?

However, pulmonologist Alain Didier said that most allergen immunotherapy trial results have been negative, and he suggested that people with cat allergies can vaccinate the cat against Fel d 1 or feed it a diet rich in Immunoglobulin Y.
