
# H5N1 avian influenza found in more cats, skunks, mice

Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy

The USDA recently confirmed 15 cases of H5N1 avian influenza in mammals, including domestic cats in Kansas, Pennsylvania, Iowa and Illinois, as well as skunks, mice, foxes, a raccoon and a bobcat. The department also reported H5N1 outbreaks in poultry in Indiana and Maryland and in another dairy cattle herd in California.



# Claw Growth Rates in a Subset of Adult, Indoor, Domestic Cats (*Felis Catus*)

Veterinary Dermatology

Researchers measured claw growth rates in 17 indoor, neutered adult cats and found front claws grew faster (0.13 mm/day) than rear claws (0.08 mm/day). These findings provide the first recorded growth rates in cats, aiding future studies on claw-based hormone analysis.



# Association Between Behavioral Factors and Recurrence Rate in Cats with Feline 'Idiopathic' Cystitis

Feline idiopathic cystitis (FIC) is a serious lower urinary tract disease in cats. This study explored links between behavior and recurrence rates, hypothesizing that anxiety-related behaviors are more common in cats with recurring episodes. Data from 33 diagnosed cats showed a significant correlation between fear of strangers and recurrence.

# Pets may improve life satisfaction as much as a spouse

Pet ownership has some of the same positive effects on life satisfaction as being married or regularly socializing with family and friends, according to a study in Social Indicators Research. The study used data from 2,500 UK households and an instrumental variables approach to establish a causal link between pet ownership and life satisfaction, and found the benefit worth up to \$90,000 a year.
