Age-dependent Increase in Small Intestinal Permeability and Sex-dependent Absorptive Capacity in Cats (*Felis catus*)

Journal of Animal Physiology and Animal Nutrition

Researchers examined how aging affects digestive health in domestic cats. Using a sugar absorption test, they found that older cats had higher intestinal permeability. The findings suggest age-related changes may reduce nutrient absorption and impact feline wellbeing.

The Feline Veterinary Medical Association (FelineVMA) has published an update to the Transportation of Cats in Motor Vehicles Position Statement in the Journal of Feline Medicine and Surgery. The 2025 Transportation of Cats in Motor Vehicles Position Statement highlights the importance of transporting cats safely while minimizing stress during travel. It encourages veterinary professionals to educate cat caregivers on best practices for safe transport. "This update underscores how improper transport can increase feline stress and compromise welfare," said Ilona Rodan, DVM, DABVP (Feline), AdvCertFB, Chair of the FelineVMA Feline Welfare Committee. "The revised version also



provides new recommendations regarding the proper placement of carriers."

California has joined six other states in banning cat declawing for nonmedical reasons. The new law allows the procedure only for therapeutic purposes. The state veterinary association opposed the bill, citing professional discretion.

Variations in Body Condition Score, Inflammatory, and Metabolic Biomarkers Predict Cognitive Changes in Clinically Healthy Senior Cats

Frontiers in Aging Neuroscience

Researchers examined immune and metabolic biomarkers in 90 healthy senior cats to explore links with cognitive aging. Behavioral changes were assessed alongside inflammation markers like IL-1 β and IL-10. Findings suggest routine bloodwork may help detect early cognitive decline.

Adipose Gene Expression Related to Body Condition Score and Individual Variations in Hospitalized Cats

Scientific Reports

Researchers analyzed fat tissue from 81 cats to understand obesity-related gene expression. They found that body condition was influenced by sex, IGF-1, and inflammation-related genes. Variability in mitochondrial genes suggests potential for personalized energy regulation strategies.
